
FALL MVP TRAINING

Our MVP training of trainers is a facilitator development training that allows facilitators to advise teams and implement lessons.



MVP STUDENT LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

Ankeny Community School District hosted their second annual MVP Student Leadership Summit on November 10, 2025 at the FFA Enrichment Center in Ankeny, IA. All four MVP schools in Ankeny attended with over 450 student mentors and support staff. Session topics included leadership skills, team builders, facilitation practice, and more. The PATCVP director hosted a table at their summit and recorded videos for the "Be the M in MVP" campaign.



MICHIGAN MVP PARTNERSHIP

The PATCVP director and director of research and evaluation, along with an MVP master trainer and STAT team member, Eric Alaniz, conducted an MVP TTT to Michigan Coalition to End Domestic and Sexual Violence (MCEDSV) staff, Hope Shores Alliance staff, an Alpena Community College representative, staff from University of Michigan-Flint, and a staff member from Boys and Girls Club of Alpena on September 29-30th. The PATCVP director and director of research and evaluation onboarded 4 prevention staff from MCEDSV as new MVP master trainers to be able to sustain the program throughout the state of Michigan. We are excited for this new partnership with MCEDSV and welcome them to the MVP STAT team!

NATIONAL SEXUAL ASSAULT CONFERENCE

The director of the PATCVP attended the annual National Sexual Assault Conference hosted August 26-28, 2025 in Anaheim, CA along with 10 Iowa agencies and institutions of higher education.

IOWA AFTERSCHOOL ALLIANCE CONFERENCE

The PATCVP director spoke and had a booth at the annual Iowa After school Alliance conference held September 24-25, 2025 in Des Moines, IA on the MVP model with 23 attending the presentation.

PHOTOVOICE PROJECT TRAINING

The Iowa Coalition Against Sexual Assault hosted a training course of the Photovoice Project in December and the PATCVP direct and director of research and evaluation attended. The Photovoice Project is a community-based participatory research method where individuals use cameras to document their lives, strengths, and challenges, then collaboratively discuss their photos to foster critical consciousness and promote social action. PATCVP staff hope to utilize this project in their future work.

16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM IOWA VIRTUAL DIALOGUE

The Iowa Coalition Against Sexual Assault (IowaCASA) hosted a webinar for the internationally recognized 16 Days of Activism on digital safety on December 10, 2025 and invited the PATCVP director to be a panelist alongside SafePlace staff, ICADV staff and the IowaCASA attorney; 26 attended the presentation from across Iowa.
