

**Patricia A Tomson Center for Violence Prevention
O. Jay and Patricia Tomson Internship Scholarship (OJPTIS)
Application Form for Internships During
Academic Year 2023-2024**

About the Scholarship:

Through a generous donation to the Patricia A Tomson Center for Violence Prevention (PATCVP) from O. Jay and Patricia Tomson, the CVP offers financial support for eligible students in the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences who are undertaking internships in agencies, non-profit organizations, associations, or government agencies that have a focus on interpersonal violence such as child maltreatment, sexual, domestic, and family violence.

Internships in which students are focusing on such issues in a non-victim service oriented agency will be considered as well. Focus areas may include related policy development, partnership/coalition development, criminal justice issues, education etc.

Depending on the number of applicants, unique characteristics of the internship (e.g. location, travel, and length of the internship) or applicant needs, the individual scholarship awards may vary in amount.

Student Eligibility Requirements:

University of Northern Iowa students who are pursuing an internship experience for course credit in the violence prevention field and/or providing services to victims/survivors of domestic, sexual or family violence. Internships may be at the undergraduate or graduate level.

- Academic achievement (3.0 GPA or better).
- Have a declared major in the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences (CSBS), or pursuing a graduate degree in a program found in the College of Social and Behavioral Sciences.
- Enrolled in an internship course associated with an undergraduate major or a graduate program in CSBS. The internship should be an upper level/senior level type of internship, or associated with the program of study leading to a graduate degree.
- Have an internship agreement with a non-profit agency, association or government department who has a focus on the prevention or provision of services to victims/survivors of domestic, sexual or family violence. Or, alternatively will provide a scope of work focused on prevention or victim services in an agency setting in which the primary mission of the agency, association or government department is broader in scope.
- Demonstrated interpersonal and professional skills necessary to interface with the public, agency personnel and/or clients, or the potential thereof.
- Have a foundational understanding of the dynamics or issues associated with domestic, sexual, family, or community violence.
- Ability to participate in a scholarship recipient reception and presentation of internship experience.

Criteria for Internship sites:

- Internship sites or internship scope of work shall have a focus on providing prevention from at least one level of the multi-systemic public health model of prevention and/or services to victims/survivors of domestic, sexual or family violence.
- Have capability of providing supervision of interns in a manner that enhances their educational and professional development.
- Can provide interns with enhanced knowledge and skills in violence prevention and/or victim/survivor services.
- Collaborate with the PATCVP and the student's academic/internship supervisor to provide periodic feedback and evaluation on the intern's development and performance.

What are the expectations associated with the scholarship?

Students are expected to fulfill the expectations of their internships as determined by their Department and their faculty supervisor.

Additional expectations for the Tomson scholarship recipients are:

- **Provide timely feedback to periodic requests from the PATCVP on the Tomson Scholars Program.**
- **Complete an exit statement/form at the end of the internship.**
- **Participation in a reception recognizing the Tomson family for their support.**

How do I apply?

Students interested in applying for the OJPTIS should submit the following via email attachments to the director alysa.mozak@uni.edu and co-director michael.fleming@uni.edu of the PATCVP or alternatively submit a printed copy of the items requested below to 309 Sabin Hall, UNI:

- **A completed OJPTIS application form, including the personal statement question (see below).**
- **Resume or CV.**
- **Academic transcript or verification of having a GPA of at least 3.0.**

When is it due?

Tomson Scholarships are available for internships during the academic year as well as the summer sessions. We encourage students to submit their applications once their internship placements have been arranged.

For full consideration, and timely processing, students should submit their application **by the Friday before the semester/session in which their internship begins**. Applications submitted after this time will be considered as funds allow. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
